Suitable for young and old alike, this interactive exhibit tells the story of 1 tower surrounded by over 1,000 years of history and heritage.

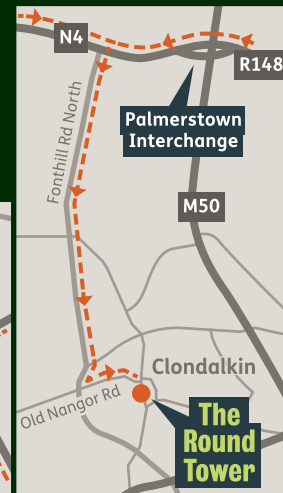

Interactive touchscreens featuring games and quizzes make this an immersive experience for all ages.

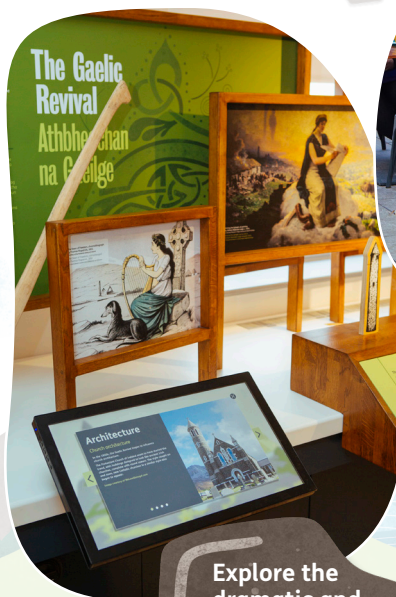


A trip to the Round Tower isn't complete without a visit to the East Village café, where delicious locally sourced food meets friendly service.
